#### Notes on contributors

**David Aradeon** - Professor of Architecture at the University of Lagos and foremost Nigerian architect. He is a consultant to various world bodies and has completed designs for private and public buildings in Africa and the United States, including works of preservation on historical houses and their adaptation for contemporary functions. One of his latest publications is *The Dictionary of Art*, Macmillan, London, 1996.

**Rick Pirro** - Is an art critic and reviewer based in Los Angeles.

**Femi Fatoba** - Actor, poet and Senior Lecturer in Theatre Arts at the University of Ibadan. Fatoba is a specialist in voice and speech, dance and movement and mime as well as acting and aesthetics. Among his best-known poems are *Nepatitis* and *They Said I abused The Government*. Author of *Petals of Thought* (a collection of poems) and a work in progress on the stagecraft of *Ola Rotimi*.

**Akin Adesokan** - A journalist and writer. He has just completed a novel, *Roots in the sky*; he lives in Lagos.

**Kofi Anyidoho** - Professor of literature and Acting Director of the School of Performing Arts, University of Ghana, Legon. Anyidoho, a well-known poet and literary scholar, has among several publications, *Ancestrallogics* and *Caribbeanblues*, his latest. He is also a contributing editor to *Glendora Review*.

**Olusegun Adekoya** - Poet and teacher of poetry and drama at the Obafemi Awolowo University, Ile-Ife. Adekoya authored the article, *The Relevance of a Vision*, written around the late poet, Christopher Okigbo and was published in *Glendora Review* No. 2. His byline evaporated in the course of production.

**Hakeem Bello** - An assistant editor with *Sunday Times*, Lagos.

**Steve Shaba** - is the chief executive of Kraft Books, a publishing company based in Ibadan.

**Tehteh** - is the pseudonym of the author of a collection of short stories, *The Country Stories* which was top prize winner in the 1995 Valco Trust Fund Literary Awards. *The Fortune of Manu* is a part of the collection. Tehteh works with the Council for

Scientific and Industrial Research in Accra.

**Muyiwa Adekeye** - Assistant editor with the magazine, *The News*. He covered the entire proceedings of the Ogoni trials in Port Harcourt.

**Okwui Enwezor** - is the editor and publisher of *Nka*, a journal of contemporary African art based in New York.

**Kwesi Yankah** - Associate professor and head of the department of Linguistics, University of Ghana, Legon. Professor Yankah is a well-known research scholar with specialisation in folklore, language, culture and communication. He is a popular columnist and satirist.

**Sola Olorunyomi** - An editor with the *Weekly Monitor*, a magazine published in Ibadan. Olorunyomi is currently also the editor of the *Association of Nigerian Authors Review*.

**Ezenwa Ohaeto** - A poet and literary critic. He is a senior lecturer at the Alvan Ikoku College of Education, Owerri.

**Maurice Archibong** - A freelance art journalist and reviewer based in Lagos.

**Ossie Enekwe** - Well-known poet and professor of English at the University of Nigeria, Nsukka. He succeeded Chinua Achebe as the editor of *Okike*, journal of new writing.

**Ofotsu Adinku** - senior lecturer and head of the Dance Section of the department of Theatre Arts, University of Ghana. Adinku began his professional career as one of the early members of the Ghana Dance Ensemble, and is currently one of the leading choreographers in Ghana.

**Bunmi Alegbeleye** - Associate professor in the department of Library, Archives and Information Studies, University of Ibadan. He specialises in Records and Information Management, Archives Administration and Conservation. Currently he is the chairman of IFLA/ICA Commission on preservation and conservation.
